Peter Mark Memorial Award

To recognize outstanding theoretical or experimental work by an early career scientist or engineer.

The nominee must be an early career scientist or engineer in academia, government, or industry who has contributed outstanding theoretical or experimental work **at least part of which must have been published in an AVS Journal**. **The nominee must have worked in a scientific/technical field(s) for no more than 10 years (cumulative) after receiving their Ph.D.**

In any given year an individual may provide a nominating or supporting letter for only one candidate for each award. The award shall be granted without restrictions except that current members of the Board of Directors and the Awards Committee are not eligible. Further, no member of the Awards Committee may nominate or support any nomination. The AVS Awards Committee reserves the right to consider a candidate for a different award category.

Please read the description for the award that you are submitting.

This section represents the substance of the entry so please be as concise, clear and informative as possible. Specific, factual, and convincing information will be the basis upon which the entry will be evaluated.

Describe the nominee's theoretical and/or experimental accomplishments. It is important to describe the impact of the nominee's contributions on the field as they relate to the award. The numbers of publications and words citations provide a measure of impact. However, the committee is looking for **specific examples** of how the nominee's work has significantly advanced/impacted their institution, industry, research area, and/or science and technology in general. (less than 750 words) 750 words

List the nominee's number of peer reviewed publications, H-factor, and total number of citations (indicating source - e.g. Web of Science, Google Scholar ...) and ten most relevant publications (including authors and titles)

List **ALL** publications published in AVS Journals

List the nominee's relevant patents (Up to 10)

Describe the nominee's professional service and subsequent contributions to the scientific community, especially AVS. This section should include any professional leadership positions, committee service, editorial work, outreach and other service initiatives. **This should be more than a list of service roles. Please discuss the impact of their service on the field and community.** (less than 750 words) 750 words

Any other input that would be useful to the Award Committee. (less than 150 words). (optional) 150 words

1. Upload JPEG or PDF files. Maximum file size is 5MB per piece. A maximum of five pieces can be uploaded with your entry.
